We are proud to have a highly respected reputation of being a leading provider of critical services for individuals with disabilities. Our future is bright as we work to transition our day programs toward total inclusion, which provides community-based activities, more vocational options, volunteering and overall neighborhood engagement.

It is hard to believe that we are going on two years of managing the impact of COVID-19 pandemic. From adhering to safety protocols to coordinating vaccinations for our individuals served, staff and even our family members, the health and wellbeing of our constituents remains our top priority. The times have been challenging for everybody, but with challenges come opportunities. At Shore, we have embraced the challenges and set out to restructure the Life In Motion Program at the Lois Lloyd Center. The group rooms will be themed (e.g. Cultural & Current Events, Science & Horticulture, Computer & Internet, Art & Music and Cooking), and our clients will rotate several times during the day. The True North-Find Your Path Program is using a new curriculum called "The Current", and was able to offer a 16-week in-person theatre experience through a collaboration with the Still Point Theatre Collective through a generous grant from The Driskill Foundation.

You will also read about Tanya, Tehran and Michael, who are only a few of our clients, gaining independent skills that help enrich and fulfill their lives. Together you can help Shore write more success stories as we embark on the next 70 years!





During this time, he has gained independent living skills and is more expressive about his wants and needs. Tehran enjoys being outdoors; listening and singing to music; and sitting by the window while on car rides to activities in the community. He has а good camaraderie with his fellow housemates and staff at home and at the Lois Lloyd Center where he receives daily program services in developmental training. Some of Tehran's favorite enrichment activities while at the center include: exercising, cooking, going on outings and participating in karaoke.

"Kimley Stanton, Direct Support Professional at the Lois Lloyd Center, stated, "It has been great working with Tehran. He calls me Nana ever since he overheard me say "It's Nana" to my granddaughter while on a call. On the weekends, Tehran will even ask "Where's Nana" since he is used to seeing me every day." This is a true testament of the special bonds our staff share with our individuals served.



TANYA

For nearly 20 years, Tanya has received vocational training at the Joseph Koenig, Sr. Training Center. Like most, Tanya missed Shore while the day program was for closed for nearly six months in 2020 due to COVID-19. Once Tanva returned to the center, she was ready to work on packaging and fulfillment orders for area companies that contract with Shore. Her productivity continues to increase and she is always eager to learn new job skills. Tanya is well liked by her friends at Shore and is very polite and respectful to others. Anni Braverman, Director of Vocational Services, stated, "Tanya is a great worker! She is always willing to complete production that is available." In June 2021, Shore presented Tanva with a Personal Achievement Award for the accomplishments she has made. In Tanya's free time, she likes shop and listen to the Beatles and Rolling Stones.

Michael has his own room and uses the second floor bedroom as his hangout to listen to music, read books or to simply relax. Eventually, this area will become his bedroom as it was recently remodeled to make room for a third resident in the house. Michael made a smooth transition from living with his family to the CILA and settled in nicely. He gets along well with his housemate Sam and they are always on the move with staff. Since Michael moved in, he has lost 40 pounds, which is primarily from all the exercise he gets while walking around in the community.

Michael is improving his daily living skills and likes to help prepare meals and clean. To keep some continuity, Michael attends the Douglas Center during the day. Recently, he started taking the PACE bus from his day program and adjusted well to this routine change. We look forward to Michael gaining more independence.
